Bishop McGann-Mercy High School has taken Camp Wilbur Herrlich under its wing through its Ethics and Leadership Club, moderated by Mrs. Ann Corrao, a teacher who shared her heartfelt love of the camp with her students. The club was organized in 2009 when an alumni connection was discovered through Mrs. Jessica Vanacoro, a Mercy High School graduate, which led Mrs. Corrao to talk about her connection to the camp. And so, a group of students spearheaded the birth of a new organization at Mercy HS.

The students rallied and took to heart the mission and vision they saw through the eyes of the camp. They wanted to reach out into the community and make a difference in lives of the children. Their main goal was to scholarship children and help collect everyday necessities that campers needed and might not be able to provide for themselves.

The club members' second goal was to participate in the annual work weekend and help ready the grounds for the campers. This has resulted in attending work weekends since 2009. The students rally themselves, parents, teachers, and alumni to journey three hours upstate and accomplish rewarding hard work sprinkled with some fun, from Friday to Sunday every third weekend in May. They leave exhausted, happy, fulfilled, and blessed blessed in experiencing the "feeling" of doing for those they will never meet, but knowing they have touched their lives.

Thirdly, they work all year to gather needed items, make incentive envelopes for the campers, and provide scholarship funds. This last year they were guest speakers at a meeting for Girl Scout Troop 3728 from Suffolk County. The Girl Scouts were so inspired by the presentation of the Ethics and Leadership Club and the members' experiences with Camp Herrlich that they decided to join the school in their endeavors. In doing so, they were honored their Silver Award status. They made a cash donation of \$1,300.00, and camper incentive envelopes of



Camper Growth

We strive to help children grow socially and emotionally when they are with us in our programs, so we asked parents to tell us if they have seen any growth in their child.

95% of parents reported that their children showed improvement in their Ease of Making New Friends, with 28% reporting Great Improvement

80% of parents reported that their child showed improvement in Overcoming Fears and Challenges, with 38% reporting Great Improvement

80% of parents reported that their child showed improvement in their Confidence, with 41% reporting Great Improvement

77% of parents reported that their child showed improvement in their Acceptance of Differences, with 38% reporting Great Improvement.

This summer we partnered with the Bramley Cluster Summer Camp in Leeds, UK to do a Pen Pal program. The Bramley Cluster Summer Camp was founded by our past Resident Program Director, Danny Bullock. For three weeks, campers in both our program and the Leeds program were assigned a counterpart to write letters to. Because of the quick turnaround time, the letters were scanned and then distributed "across the pond." Campers then were able to write return letters and scan them back. It was a great opportunity for our USA kids and their UK kids to learn about each other, not only through the letters but also through Vlogs (video-logs) they made for each other, with introductions and a quick little quiz on what different things are called in our own parts of the world. The kids really got a kick out of hearing a "truck" called a "lorry" and "chips" called "crisps." This Pen Pal program is just another way that we expand our campers' worlds while they are with us.
