OCFS Awards Health & Safety Grant to Herrlich's After School Programs

Governor George E. Pataki announced that 74 grants administered by the New York State Office of Children and Family Services were awarded in the areas of Health & Safety, Start-up and Expansion, and extension of operating hours for School Age Child Care programs.
